Huge well done to Cameron, Jaden, Isie and Hameedah! We hope you had an amazing time!








BAE Systems Roadshow!



Steve Willis Apprenticeships Taster Session!


On Wednesday 15th May, a few Year 10s visited Steve Willis for an Apprenticeship Taster session!

On the 3rd of June, the History Subject Champions from our school embarked on an enlightening journey to the D-Day Museum in Southsea as part of the D-Day 80 commemorations.

The highlight of the trip was undoubtedly the opportunity to meet several D-Day veterans, some of whom are approaching the remarkable age of 100. These living legends shared their personal stories and experiences from the fateful day of June 6, 1944, providing the students with a rare and invaluable perspective on the events that shaped the course of World War II. Listening to these veterans, who were once young soldiers, our history champions felt an overwhelming sense of gratitude and admiration for their bravery and sacrifice.


The museum itself offered a wealth of exhibits and artefacts that deepened our understanding of the D-Day landings and the broader context of World War II. One of the most impressive exhibits was the Overlord Embroidery. Adding a delightful touch to the visit was a performance by the D-Day Darlings. This musical group, known for their vintage style and nostalgic repertoire, brought the era to life through their heartfelt renditions of wartime songs. The D-Day Darlings' performance was not just entertaining but also a poignant reminder of the power of music to uplift and unite people during times of hardship.







Mental Health Assembly



A huge well done to Mr Waldren and students and staff who joined in and cheered Mr Waldren on!


A message from Mr Waldren:




